Japan Kenya Foreign Ministerial Meeting



On the 25th of August 2017, the Tokyo International Conference in African Development (TICAD) Ministerial meeting was held at Maputo, Mozambique. The meeting was attended by Mr. Taro Kono, Minister for Foreign Affairs, from the Japanese Government. Ambassador Amina C. Mohamed Cabinet Secretary for Foreign Affairs, who was leading the Kenyan Delegation, also attended to the same meeting. Ambassador Amina had a Foreign Ministerial (bilateral) meeting with Japanese Foreign Minister Mr. Kono.

The Foreign Ministers expressed their satisfaction at the longstanding cordial and friendly bilateral relations existing between the two countries and reaffirmed their commitment to further strengthen these relations.

The Ministerial meeting in Maputo saw a significant number of Foreign Ministers and other Ministers of the countries in the African continent in attendance.



Japan Kenya Investment Agreement

On the 14th of September 2017, an agreement, for the Promotion and Protection of Investment, between the Government of Japan and the Government of the Republic of Kenya was entered into force. The agreement was signed in August 2016 by Mr. Fumio Kishida, former Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan, and Mr. Henry K. Rotich, Cabinet Secretary for National Treasury of the Republic of Kenya, in Nairobi, Kenya, during the Sixth Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD VI). This agreement aims at improving the legal stability with respect to the investment, and is expected to bolster economic relations between the two countries.

Africa Rapid Deployment of Engineering Capabilities (ARDEC)

On the 24th of July 2017, Japan dispatched 17 personnel from the Japan Ground Self-Defense Force to the fourth African Rapid Deployment of Engineering Capabilities (ARDEC) training, implemented by the UN Department of Field Support.

The training, which took place in Kenya from July 24th to September 15th, aimed to strengthen the engineering capability of the Kenya, Tanzania, Burundi and Uganda Defense Forces on the operation of heavy equipment.



On the 23rd of August 2017, Kenya signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to secure pre-games training camp for Kenya's Olympic and Paralympic team ahead of the Tokyo 2020 Games.

Kurume City and Fukuoka Prefecture will provide training fields, facilities and economic contributions to Team Kenya to acclimatize in their preparation for the games. Kurume City is located in Fukuoka Prefecture.



From 15th to 17th of September 2017, the Embassy of Japan in Kenya hosted an International Seminar by the Zurich based Aikido Ikeda Dojo Association from Switzerland, who was in Kenya to support Kenya's Nairobi Aikikai.
