## NAROK COUNTY RESIDENTS REJOICE OVER NEW COMMUNITY DISPENSARY FUNDED BY JAPAN

Residents of Suswa in Narok County rejoiced with dance as their new dispensary funded by the Government of Japan came to a completion

A ceremony to hand over the new dispensary funded through Japan's Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) was today presided over by Mr. Mikio Mori, Deputy Ambassador of Embassy of Japan in Kenya. The *Project for the construction of Suswa Dispensary* received a grant of Kshs 7.2 million (USD 87,867).

• The afternoon inauguration ceremony held at the dispensary was also witnessed by the County Executive Committee Member of Public Service Management, Hon. George Meshuko, County Executive Committee Member of Health, Hon. John Marindany, County Director of Health, Mr. Wilson Gachare, officials from the local authority, a representative of Baptist Relief Agency in Africa (BARAA), committee members and medical staff.

The project plan was initiated by BARAA together with the local community in 2011. During that time, the area was in serious need of a medical facility since the nearest hospital was 30km away. Having a dispensary in the vicinity was for many years a dream of the people of Suswa.

At the ceremony, mothers from the community danced to Maasai traditional songs to express their joy and appreciation as they felt relieved from future complications during delivery.

With the GGP grant, the community has been able to construct a dispensary, a staff house, and toilets, and install solar power, equip the centre, purchase water tanks as well as furniture.

In his remarks, Mr. Mori congratulated the organization and community for the successful completion of the project and hoped that the new Suswa dispensary would not only bring them

improved health care but also enhance the wellbeing of the community
