Joint Ceremony of Japan's Grant Aid for Infrastructure Projects



On 22nd March 2018, the Government of the Republic of Kenya organised an official ceremony to mark the Commissioning of Ngong Road Phase 1, the launch of the Dualling of the Ngong Road Phase 2 and the Handing Over of Road Construction Equipment, by courtesy of Japan's ODA grant amounting to approximately 4.325 billion KES. The ceremony was held opposite Prestige Plaza on Ngong Road. H.E. Uhuru Kenyatta and H.E. Toshitsugu Uesawa graced the event as the primary speakers. The President of Kenya and the Ambassador of Japan to Kenya unveiled the commemorative monument solidifying the growing relations between Kenya and Japan in line with the Big 4 Agenda.

Exchange of Notes Signing Ceremony

On 16th March 2018, the Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Kenya, H.E. Mr. Toshitsugu Uesawa, signed and exchanged notes with Mr. Henry Rotich, Cabinet

Secretary for National Treasury and Planning, for the Olkaria I units 1, 2 and 3 Geothermal Power Plant rehabilitation project and for the Purchase of Patrol Boats for fisheries.

During the ceremony, Ambassador Uesawa spoke on Japan's technology expertise stating that Japan's partnership supports the BIG 4 Agenda in the areas



of manufacturing and blue economy. Mr. Rotich welcomed the support of the Government of Japan and commended the joint partnership in the geothermal sector.

Other officials present at the ceremony included Ms. Keiko Sano, Chief Representative, JICA; Mrs. Rebecca Miano, CEO, KenGen; and Mr. William Mbaka, Chief Finance Officer, Ministry of Energy.

 sustainability for agricultural producers.
- The Project on Rice Research for Tailor-made Breeding and Cultivation Technology
 Development in Kenya (SATREPS Project) Development of rice varieties that can
 overcome stress conditions in Kenya and cultivation technologies that maximize the
 potential of individual rice varieties for sustainable rice production

(1.) Japanese Speech Contest
