


TICAD Mini Consultative Conference



On 11th September 2018, a consultative conference building on the progress made thus far post TICAD VI was held at the Panafric Hotel, Nairobi. H. E. Ambassador. Toshitsugu Uesawa, Ambassador of Japan; Ambassador Benson Ogutu, Director of International Conferences and Events Directorate, Ministry of

Foreign Affairs; Mr. James Maina, Deputy Chief Economist, State Department for Planning; Mr. Siddharth Chatterjee, UN Resident Coordinator and UNDP Resident Representative; Mr. Johan Mistiaen, World Bank Program Leader and Lead Economist; and Dr. Mohammed, African Union representative graced the event as the key speakers. Ambassador Uesawa spoke fondly of the collaboration between the Government of Japan and Africa at large echoing Japan's continued support in the development of the continent through infrastructure, agriculture and blue economy advances.

Project for Rural Water Supply

The Embassy of Japan participated in the commissioning ceremony of JICA's Project for Rural Water Supply project in Baringo County on 27th of July hosted by Government of Kenya, in the presence of William Ruto, Deputy President of the Republic of Kenya, H.E. Simon Chelugui, CS of Ministry of Water and Sanitation and H.E. Stanley Kiptis, Governor of Baringo County. This project has installed 70 boreholes in 70 villages in Baringo, where people were dependent for their livelihoods and survival, on unstable rainfall seasons, which come by twice a year.



Signing Ceremony of the Exchange of Notes for the Economic and Social Development Programme "Medical and Welfare Equipment" in Nairobi

On 8th August 2018, H.E. Mr. Toshitsugu Uesawa, Ambassador of Japan, signed and exchanged notes with Mr. Henry K. Rotich, Cabinet Secretary, The National Treasury and Planning, for the Economic and Social Development Programme "Medical and welfare equipment" as a grant of four hundred million Japanese Yen (¥400,000,000). This cooperation aims to strengthen countermeasures against cancer such as breast cancer by providing medical equipment such as mammography. Japan has announced its efforts to "Promoting Resilient Health Systems for quality of life"at the Sixth Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD VI) and this cooperation will embody the same statement.

Official Development Assistance (ODA) refers to grants, loans, etc. with concessional conditions that are given to developing countries and regions, mainly for the purpose of contributing to the improvement of economic development and welfare.

- Agricultural Development
- Environmental Conservation
- Human Resource Management
- Health and Medical Care

The Judo Japanese Ambassador's Cup is part of the Sport for Tomorrow program which is an initiative led by the Government of Japan that focuses on cooperating with developing countries with an aim to promote sport and the Olympic and Paralympic movement in both tangible and intangible ways.

The judo cup was attended by the Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Kenya, H. E. Mr. Toshitsugu Uesawa, the Principal Secretary, State Department of Sports Development Amb. Kirimi P. Kaberia and officials

of the Kenya Judo Association led by the president, Mr. Shadrack Maluki.

Also in attendance were 15 Judo clubs totaling to 150 judokas. The judokas included teams from the Kenya Defence Forces, Kenya Prisons, Kenyatta University, Embassy of Japan and judo clubs from areas such as Mombasa, Kwale, Kilifi, Kiambu, Kajiado and Nakuru. The overall winners of the cadet category was the Diani Judo Club from Kilifi County, from the juniors category Kajiado Judo Club from Kajiado County and from the seniors category, the Kenya Defence Forces.

Lastly, a documentary titled *Never Ending Man - Hayao Miyazaki*, which follows the retirement and return of the director of Spirited Away among other popular animations was also shown.
