Ground Breaking Ceremony for the Dongo Kundu Special Economic Zone and Launch of the Construction works for Dongo Kundu Bypass



The Ground Breaking Ceremony for the Dongo Kundu Special Economic Zone and Launch of the Construction works for Dongo Kundu Bypass was held in Mombasa County on 18th October 2019. The Dongo Kundu Special Economic Zone project is one of the flagship projects of Kenya's VISION 2030. Upon completion of this project, Mombasa is expected develop into a world class industrial hub and a gateway city for the entire Eastern and Central Africa.

H.E. Hon. Uhuru Kenyatta, President of the Republic of Kenya was the Chief Guest at the event. President Uhuru Kenyatta expressed his gratitude for support and cooperation from Japan.

In his remarks, H.E. Mr. Horie Ryoichi, Ambassador of Japan to Kenya reiterated Japan's commitment in supporting the BIG 4 agenda, Kenya's development blueprint by

ceremony. The project received a grant amount of USD 88,863 by Japan.


Handing Over Ceremony for over the project for the Development of Educational Infrastructure at Ntoluo Primary School

On 1st November, 2019 H.E. Mr. Horie Ryoichi, Ambassador of Japan to the Republic of Kenya and Mr. Rainer Frauenfeld, Director, UNOPS Kenya Multi Country Office signed the Exchange of Notes (E/N) for the Grant Assistance

Project "Enhancing Trade Facilitation and Border Control Capacity in East Africa".

The Government of Japan funded the JPY 351 million (approximately KHS 335 million) project for the purpose of providing equipment such as X-ray baggage scanners, patrol boats and vehicles for the five EAC countries - Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania and Uganda in order to strengthen the function of facilitating trade across these countries, appropriating customs clearance and preventing illegal imports and exports.

Major (Rtd) Samuel Muraya Kariuki, Deputy Commissioner, Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA) who participated as an observer, expressed great appreciation for the many years of support from Japan to EAC's efforts in taking countermeasures against terrorism.




