
Conferment of His Majesty Japanese Emperor's decoration "The Order of the Rising Sun, Gold and Silver Star" upon Ambassador Dennis Awori

On 25th June, 2021, H.E. Ambassador HORIE Ryoichi celebrated the conferment of His Majesty Japanese Emperor's decoration "The Order of the Rising Sun, Gold and Silver Star" upon Ambassador Dennis Awori at his residence.



The decoration was conferred by His Majesty the Emperor of Japan on 29th April, the 3rd year of Reiwa (2021) and witnessed by Japan's Prime Minister Mr. SUGA Yoshihide, to acknowledge Amb. Awori's contribution to the development of the bilateral relationship between Japan and Kenya during his five year tenure as the Kenyan Ambassador to Japan and as a shining business leader in bridging the two countries together.

During the ceremony, Ambassador Horie conveyed his congratulations to Ambassador Awori. Ambassador Awori in turn expressed his appreciation to Japanese people and reassured his continuous engagement in strengthening Japan-Kenya bilateral relations. On 11th June, 2021, H.E. Ambassador HORIE Ryoichi, bestowed the Japanese decoration of "the Order of the Rising Sun, Gold and Silver Rays" upon Mr. Douglas M. Wakiihuri, on behalf of the Government of Japan, at his residence. The decoration was conferred by His Majesty the Emperor of Japan on 29th April, the 3rd year of Reiwa (2021) to acknowledge Mr. Wakiihuri's great contribution to the development and promotion of Japan-Kenya bilateral relations in the sporting and cultural fields.

Mr. Wakiihuri paved way for the practice of Kenyans running for Japanese company teams, a practice that has seen foreign

athletes training with young Japanese athletes who go on to become world-leading marathon runners. Moreover, after his retirement, Mr. Wakiihuri has been positively engaging in boosting the bilateral cultural relationship between Japan and Kenya and extending cooperative support on various occasions, such as the organisation of the Nairobi Sotokoto Marathon.

COVAX AMC Summit

The Government of Japan and Gavi cohosted the COVAX AMC Summit on 2nd June, 2021. The summit aimed to raise additional funding to secure vaccines for developing countries by the end of 2021 thereby overcoming the COVID-19 pandemic.

- During the summit,

Prime Minister Suga called for further solidarity and commitment from the international community in the fight against COVID-19, and expressed Japan's full support for ensuring equitable access to safe and effective vaccines with a view to achieving Universal Health Coverage.

He also explained Japan's continued support for the efforts by the COVAX Facility, including its financial contribution amounting to 200 million USD and an additional contribution of 800 million USD. Furthermore, he expressed Japan's intention to provide, when circumstances allow and at an appropriate time, around 30 million doses of vaccines manufactured in Japan to other countries and regions, including through the COVAX Facility.

Emergency Grant Aid in Improving Cold Chain in Kenya and Somalia

The Government of Japan decided to extend Emergency Grant Aid about \$ 2 million (212 million Ksh) to Kenya and \$900,000 to Somalia through the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to improve the cold chain capacity for COVID-19 vaccines roll out, as part of approximately \$ 39 million to Latin America and the Caribbean and African countries that suffer from the impact of COVID-19.

This funding will be utilised to provide cold chain equipment including medical equipment and transportation as well as training for health worker to use the facilities, as "Last One Mile Support" to ensure vaccination in each country, through UNICEF.

Japan strengthens its support for Kenya's fight against COVID-19 with additional PCR Test Kits



On 3rd June, 2021, H.E. Ambassador HORIE Ryoichi and Mr. IWAMA Hajime, Chief Representative of JICA in Kenya handed over 75,000 PCR test kits to Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI). The donation, which was made through JICA, is the second from Japan to KEMRI to boost Kenya's

efforts to contain the spread of the corona virus. The first donation was handed over in August 2020.

Over the past 40 years, Japan has developed cordial relations with KEMRI since it first supported the establishment of the institution in 1979. During the handing over of the test kits to Hon. Mutahi Kagwe, Ambassador HORIE expressed his expectation that the additional support will assist the Government of Kenya in accurately assessing the infection situation in the country.

Ambassador Horie also introduced two Japanese nationals, Dr. TAMAKI Raita and Dr. SHIMIZU Kazuki, who are currently working at the forefront of Kenya's battle against the COVID-19. The former is working in the Ministry of Health as a Disease Surveillance Advisor, and the latter is working in the WHO office in Kenya in supporting the Emergency Operating Centre in the Ministry of Health.

Currently, ensuring equitable access globally including in developing countries and accelerating vaccination is the common challenge for the international community towards the goal of containing COVID-19. Japan has been contributing to formulating the COVAX Facility, an international mechanism for the procurement of vaccines, and has already made financial contribution of 200 million US dollars in total. Japan's Emergency Grant Aid this time aims to deliver vaccines to each and every person in the all corners of developing countries, which will complement efforts of the COVAX Facility.

Based on its experience in helping build medical supply networks that reach every corner of developing countries, Japan will continue to extend support to provide vaccines to every person in the world with a view to containing COVID-19 as quickly as possible.
